

We're going to be TV stars!

Soon we will be featured on television in 44 countries in Asia, the Pacific and the Indian subcontinent. Australia Network (an arm of the ABC) is Australia's international television and online service and one of the program's they run is a series of shows about experiences of students from Asia living in Australia. Ida Puspita is a young Indonesian woman, who is studying at Wollongong University and in May she was filmed at Coomaditchie as part of her 'Australian experience'. Ida had expressed a desire to learn more about Aboriginal people and Aboriginal art in particular and we though the best way for her to do that was to get her painting.

We had a lot of fun watching Ida discover that she can actually paint while the Australia network camera man took film from every angle. Ida is a Muslim woman and it was interesting for her and Lorraine and Narelle to discuss their differences and also some similarities of life experiences in the Illawarra – which sadly includes the experience of racism.






Playgroups for Aboriginal families & children 0-5yrs.

The Port Kembla Youth Project is a not-for-profit community organisation that offers information and support to young people aged 11-18. We provide opportunities for skills development and recreation while also recognising the cultural diversity of our local area.

Just a reminder that we have moved office and we are now located at the Port Kembla Senior Citizens Centre Building, Cnr of Allan & Kembla St. Port Kembla.

Take a look at what we have been up to:

#### **Connect Up Drama**

This program which holds Drama and Visual Arts workshops will be commencing again for Term 3 in late August; running every Tuesday afternoon at the Port Kembla Youth Project. Young people with special needs will again be developing their creative skills in drama and having a great time doing it! Learning how to use voice, movement, music, props & costumes to create a show which will be performed for family and friends at the end of the year.

#### Swim Program - spaces still available!!

Our swim program is run after school on Monday and Thursday afternoons during school terms. Classes are run by AustSwim/Swim Australia qualified instructors at the recently renovated Port Kembla RSL indoor heated pool.

# Media Release - Noreen Hay MP

#### Port Privatisation yet another broken promise

Member for Wollongong Noreen Hay MP today condemned the decision by the NSW O'Farrell Government to privatise the port of Port Kembla.

Ms Hay said the Deputy Premier of NSW accused her of scare mongering when she claimed that privatisation is what they would do should they win government.

"This is just more fear and smear [from Labor]." Andrew Stoner, Illawarra Mercury, February 2, 2011

"Andrew Stoner publicly stated that they had no intentions of privatising the port of Port Kembla," Ms Hay said.

"This is another back flip by the O'Farrell Government and worse still it is a slap in the face to those who trusted their word.

"It has been said that the port of Port Kembla is the most profitable port in Australia and has been a shining example of what can be achieved with government investment.

"I call upon the local Liberals to voice the concerns of the communities they purport to represent and oppose the privatisation of our port and provide job security and confidence for the future of our region not toe the conservative party line in exchange for thirty pieces of silver (infrastructure investment as yet to be declared) by party hacks."
